

Take Me Out TO THE BALL GAME!

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A simple CVC board game!

Students start with a marker on the start space. Students roll a die and move that many spaces. Students must add a letter to the space they've landed on to make a real word. Students continue until they've reached the finish space. When a student reaches finish, they may collect a trophy card and move their marker back to the start space. Students continue playing until the teacher says stop. Whoever has the most trophy cards at the end is the winner!

REAL OR NONSENSE CVC WORD SORT!

Students take turns flipping cards, reading, sorting, and recording whether it is a real or nonsense CVC word. When sort is complete, students can graph results!

*In the back, solve this problem. How many more real words did you have than nonsense words?

ROLL A WORD!

Students can use this easy center to roll CVC words and determine if the word is real or nonsense. Students roll a die two times. The first roll determines the initial consonant and the second roll determines the vowel and final consonant. Students will record word on recording sheet and determine if it is real or nonsense. There are 4 different rolling mats.

Example:
If I rolled a 2 and a 4, my word would be "pit"
If I rolled a 3 and a 5, my word would be "can"

Round the bases!

Students cover each word with a counter. Each student has a game piece and starts on home plate. Students will roll a die and move that many spaces (students must stop on first, second, and third base). If students land on a spot with a counter, they must remove it and read the word correctly. If student reads the word correctly, they can keep counter. Students continue "rounding the bases" until all the counters are collected. Whoever has the most counters at the end wins!

CVC WORD MATS & WORD CARDS

Cut out and laminate CVC word mats for each student. Students take turns flipping a CVC picture card and writing the word on their mat with a dry-erase marker. Word cards are also included so students can play memory or mix-n-match. With mix-n-match, students all get a card and mix around the room trying to find their match (picture with word). When all students find their match, collect cards, shuffle and repeat!
