This unit includes 10 digraph passages – 2 of each: sh, th, ch, wh, and mixed digraphs. Each passage includes 2 comprehension questions as well as a place to draw (or drag a picture) to show understanding of the entire passage.

- CHAD'S LUNCH** (ch): Chad needs lunch for school. He chooses to make a ham and cheese sandwich. Then, Chad packs a bunch of cherries. Last, he adds peach juice to drink. Chad's teacher thinks he has a very good lunch.
- MITCH'S FRIENDS** (ch): Mitch is a child. He likes to play with lots of friends. He plays chess with a child. He plays checkers with a child. Mitch never cheats! His mother wishes Mitch would play with children.
- WHIM WHEAT FARM** (wh): My family went down to the Whim Wheat Farm. The farmer had a big wheelbarrow. He uses it to carry wheat. While we were there, the wheel fell off. The farmer needed help. He gave a big whistle, and his brother came. The wheelbarrow at Whim Wheat Farm was fixed. Everyone was glad!
- WHIPPED CREAM** (wh): Jen makes whipped cream. She whisks and whisks and whisks. Whoa! This is not fun, but she does not whine. When the whipped cream is big and white, Jen stops whisking. She takes a big lick. Then, she takes a nap!
- BRUSH, BRUSH** (br): Shay is a child who likes to brush her teeth. Brush! Brush! Spit! She even gets her cheeks. When Shay is done, she puts her toothbrush on the shelf. Her mouth is very fresh. Then her mother checks. Her mom says, "You are such a whiz at brushing. Too bad your brother is not!"
