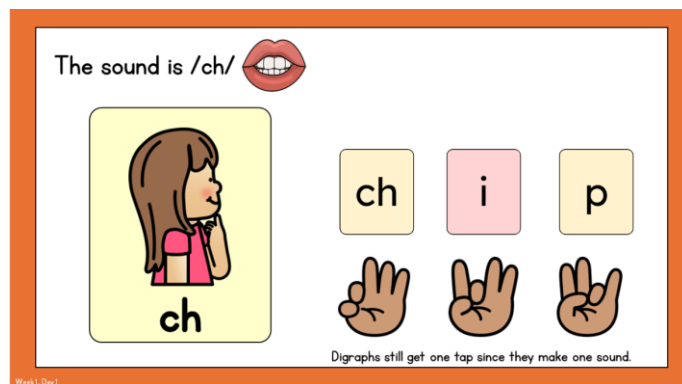


IN THIS UNIT:

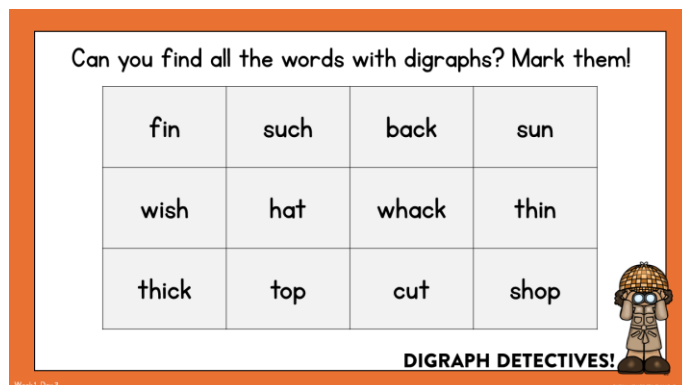
These phonics slides are meant to align with Level 1, Unit 3 of a FUN phonics program! These slides help guide your teaching and make your lessons more engaging.

This unit focuses on digraphs. There are 115 slides in this unit designed to teach students to blend sounds together to both read and write words with digraphs.

Here are some example slides:



- In this unit, students review how to tap sounds to read AND write.
- The slides include animations already with images to discuss meaning of words, and letter tiles to help blend and segment words. Be sure to put the slides in “slideshow” view.



- Students will take their word study to the next level as they must read and mark words with digraphs.
- There is a lot of blending and segmenting practice in this unit along with some real vs. nonsense practices as well.

<u>When do we use c, k, and -ck?</u>		
c	- A word begins with c if the next letter is a, o, or u. - One-syllable words do not end in c.	 cat cup
k	- A word begins with k if the next letter is i or e. - At the end of a word, k will often be used if the word has any other vowel sound besides a short vowel.	 kid
ck	- The digraph, ck, is only used at the END of words. - It follows a short vowel sound.	 duck

"k takes i and e. c takes the other three."
