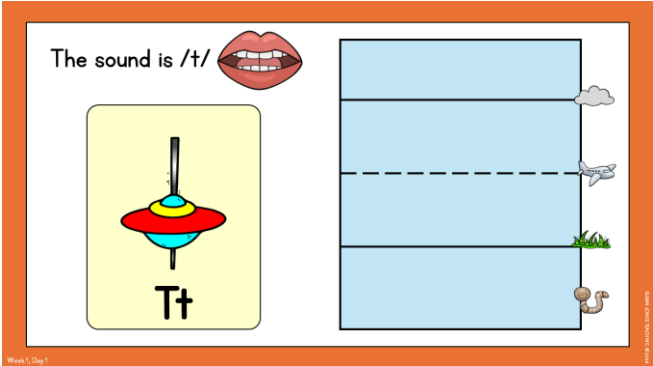


# IN THIS UNIT:

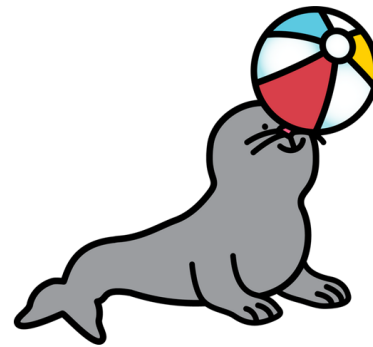
